

The Basics of Reclaiming Your Pet

Stray Hold Period

Stray animals are held for 5 calendar days before they are considered for adoption, rescue, foster care, or euthanasia, unless it is determined by a veterinarian inhumane to do so.

Proof of Ownership

Proof of ownership includes identification tag with owner information if animal arrives wearing it, microchip registration, bill of sale, photos or videos of pet clearly showing identifying traits, or veterinary records. In order to ensure proper reclaiming of strays, the Frederick County Division of Animal Control reserves the right to validate proof of ownership by requesting additional information if items provided are suspect or incomplete.

Reclaim Hours

Animals may be reclaimed during normal Administrative Office hours:

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday	8:00am – 5:00pm
Wednesday	8:00am - 7:00pm
Saturday	9:00am – 4:00pm
Sunday	Closed

*Closed Daily 12:00pm-1:00pm

Fees

There are fees associated with reclaiming your pet for the care of your pet while in the shelter. The longer your pet stays with us, the more care we provide. Care includes basic food and board and preventative vaccinations. Depending on circumstances, your pet may have required emergency veterinary care incurring additional fees that you are responsible for. All pets returned to their owners are required to be microchipped before leaving our facility.
