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MINUTES of the MARCH 8, 2017 Monthly Meeting of The Frederick County Board of Elections

ADDITIONS / CHANGES TO AGENDA:

Mr. Harvey added information about scheduled voter registration volunteer training classes to New Business.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES FOR FEBRUARY 1, 2017 BOARD MEETING:

Mr. Jeffers moved to approve as written the minutes of the February 1, 2017 board meeting. Mr. Hill seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

COUNCIL LIAISON COMMENTS:

Council Liaison was not present for this meeting.

ELECTION DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Harvey reports post-election maintenance is continuing. Staff continues working on voter updates. The agreement with the City of Frederick to support their 2017 Elections has been signed by the City and will be approved by our office today. Candidate filing window for the 2018 elections has opened as of February 28, 2017 and remains open until February 27, 2018.

OLD BUSINESS

FY 17 BUDGET UPDATE:

Mr. Harvey reports that while some items are over budget, overall the budget is healthy, and there are plenty of funds available for the remainder of the fiscal year. Due to MAEO conference reservations being inadvertently charged to office supplies, rather than travel/training, the office supply category shows as over budget. The ledger will be corrected with the County.

New document scanners for the office are arriving soon, and two new office chairs have been purchased for staff use.

CITY OF FREDERICK 2017 ELECTIONS:

At their last meeting, the City of Frederick Mayor and Board of Aldermen approved the agreement with our office. Additionally, they have approved Early Voting for the 2017 elections. The city will have 11 precincts with 7 polling places.

Mr. Harvey has met with staff regarding City needs, and will have a follow-up meeting to begin to plan processes. Staff questions have been forwarded to Phyllis Hane, the city's election liaison.

Work on election judge manuals and training schedules has begun. Mrs. Schultz will be preparing a list of our election judges who are City residents, as well as those who are County residents who worked in City polling places during the 2016 Election.

Mr. Hill asked about the process for adjusting and updating City precinct boundaries. Mr. Harvey explained that the City will provide a written description of those boundaries so the MDVOTERS street file can be updated and revised Voter Notification Cards can be sent to residents effected by precinct or polling place changes.

Mr. Jeffers asked that since the City does not have provisional voting, how will judges handle the situation? Mr. Harvey said there was nothing we can do since it would have to be added to City election law, but the City may be using Temporary Certificates of Registration.

Mr. Woodcock asked how we bill the City for time spent working on City election tasks. Mr. Harvey said staff would track time, and the Board would bill the City on a monthly basis. The office won't charge extra for regular work which happened to cover City residents, but would charge for tasks relating exclusively to the City election. Rates billed would be based on each staff member's equivalent hourly rate.

POST ELECTION MAINTENANCE:

PEM is ongoing. Ballot packing is complete, and work is beginning on ExpressVote BMD and DS200s. Once complete, 850+ voting booths will be examined for damages and sent for repairs.
