## Frederick County’s Veteran Population

There are approximately 18,000 Veterans living in Frederick County

- This is 4.4% of total Veterans living in Maryland
- About 42% are age 65 or older.
- Just over 3,400 receive disability compensation.
- Approximately 12% are females.
