Bill No. 23-07

The County Council of Frederick County, Maryland, finds it necessary and appropriate to amend the Frederick County Code to create a Behavioral Health Advisory Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF FREDERICK COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Frederick County Code be, and it is hereby, amended as shown on the attached Exhibit 1.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF FREDERICK COUNTY, MARYLAND, that there is hereby established a Behavioral Health Advisory Council.

CHAPTER 1-2: ADMINISTRATION

ARTICLE XX. FREDERICK COUNTY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ADVISORY COUNCIL

§1-2-1000. Creation, Duties.

- (A) In accordance with Title 10, Subtitle 3, Part II of the Health-General Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland for the provision of Joint Mental Health and Addictions Advisory Committees, there shall be a Frederick County Behavioral Health Advisory Council (“Council”).
- (B) Powers. The Council may:
- (1) Create subcommittees;
 - (2) Have additional members participate as needed; and
 - (3) Consult with State and County agencies to obtain such technical assistance and advice as it considers necessary to complete its duties.
- (C) Duties. The Council shall:
- (1) Monitor, review and evaluate the allocation and adequacy of publicly funded behavioral health services within the county;
 - (2) Determine the needs of the county behavioral health system, including quality of services, gaps in the system, and interagency coordination;
 - (3) Participate in the development of the local behavioral health plan and budget;
 - (4) Prepare and disseminate an annual report in form and to required parties in accordance with § 10-312 of the Health-General Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland;
 - (5) Review and comment on the annual county behavioral health plan and preliminary budget, before submission of the budget to the state; and

6 The Council shall include the following:

8 (A) As nonvoting ex officio members, the following individuals or their designees:

10 (1) The Health Officer for the County;

12 (2) A representative of a state inpatient facility that serves the County,
13 appointed as provided in subparagraph (2) of this section;

15 (3) The Director of Behavioral Health Services Division, Frederick County
16 Health Department; and

18 (4) The Director of the Local Behavioral Health Authority; and

20 (5) A representative from the County Council; and

22 (B) As voting members and representatives of the County's major socio-economic
23 and ethnic groups:

25 (1) The County Executive shall appoint at least 5, but not more than 7,
26 representatives selected from among the following:

28 (a) The Office of the County Executive;

30 (b) The Superintendent of Frederick County Public Schools, or the
31 Superintendent's designee;

33 (c) The Director of the County's Department of Social Services, or the
34 Director's designee;

36 (d) Practicing physicians;

38 (e) Behavioral health professionals who are not physicians;

3 (h) The head of a local law enforcement agency, or their designee;

5 (i) A county general hospital that contains an inpatient behavioral
6 health unit;

8 (j) The Director of the County Division of Senior Services, or the
9 Director's designee;

10 (k) The Regional Director of the Department of Juvenile Services, or
11 the Director's designee;

13 (l) The Director of the Division of Fire and Rescue Services, or the
14 Director's designee; and

16 (m) A community rehabilitation or housing program that operates in
17 the county; and

19 (2) The County Executive shall appoint at least 2 but not more than 4
20 members, selected from among the following groups or organizations:

22 (a) Individuals who are currently receiving or who have in the past
23 received behavioral health services;

25 (b) Parents or other relatives of adults with behavioral health
26 disorders;

28 (c) Parents or other relatives of children or adolescents with
29 emotional, behavioral, or mental health disorders the onset of
30 which occurred during childhood or adolescence;

32 (d) The Frederick County Mental Health Association; and

34 (e) A member of the general public.

37 (C) The County Executive may appoint any additional non-voting members to the
38 Council as necessary to advise and advocate about behavioral health issues.

2 (A) The term of an appointed member is three years and begins on July 1.
3
4 (B) Staggered Terms. Of the initial members one-third shall be appointed for a three
5 (3) year term, one-third shall be appointed to a two (2) year term and one-third
6 shall be appointed for a one (1) year term which shall end each year on June 30.
7
8 (C) Term Limits. A member who serves two consecutive full three-year terms may not
9 be reappointed for two years after completion of those terms.
10 ~~[(D) Compensation. Members of the Council shall receive no salaries but shall be~~
11 ~~reimbursed for all expenses necessarily incurred in the performance of their~~
12 ~~duties in accordance with the appropriations approved by the County~~
13 ~~Council.]]~~

15 **§1-2-1003. Chair, Vice-Chair.**
16

- 17 (A) The Council shall elect annually a Chair and Vice-Chair from among its members
18 to serve a single year term.
19
20 (B) A Member may not serve as Chair for more than two consecutive years.
21
22 (C) The Chair shall preside at all meetings of the Council.
23
24 (D) The Vice Chair shall assume all duties of the Chair in the absence of the Chair
25 and shall perform other duties as assigned by the Chair.
26
27 (E) The Council may elect other officers as needed. The manner of election of
28 additional officers shall be as the Council determines.

30 **§1-2-1004. Meetings, Quorum.**
31

- 32 (A) Meetings. The Council shall have not fewer than six meetings per year at the
33 times and places that the Council determines.
34
35 (B) Quorum.
36
37 (1) A majority of the voting members present of the Council shall constitute a
38 quorum for the transaction of business; and

40 (2) An affirmative vote by the majority of those present at any meeting shall
41 be sufficient for any official action.
